
# Paul Meets Lydia

(based on Acts 16:9–15)

Use one or more activities from each section to explore grace and gratitude with your children this week.

#### **Recognizing God's Grace**

- Read and enjoy the story with your children imagine and wonder.
- Grab a blanket and go outside, if possible, near a fountain or flowing water. Invite people to look at God's beautiful world, including at the people who may be in the area. Praise God and pray.
- Lydia made new friends at the river. Invite your children to name their friends and tell how they know them. Invite your children to think about people they do not know and where they could meet them. Listen to their wonderings about people. Thank God for old and new friends. Ask God to help your children make new friends and to be faithful friends.



## Responding to God's Grace

- Outline the days of this week on a printed calendar in purple marker or crayon. Give your children star stickers. At the end of each day, invite your children to put a star sticker on the day if they played with a friend or spoke to someone new. Some days may have stickers; other days may not. Encourage your children to watch for and respond to God's Spirit bringing people into their lives, old and new friends.
- God called Lydia to invite people to her home and to tell them about God. Help your family listen for and discern God's call to mission. Place a large sheet of paper and crayons on the table or floor. Invite people to stop anytime during the week and draw a picture of someone or something that they feel needs God's love and help.
- Wear something purple this week and remember Lydia, a woman who became a follower of Jesus and responded with gratitude and hospitality.
  Practice hospitality this week by trying some of the following actions: greeting others, asking about their day (and listening to their response), sharing something, inviting someone to your home, preparing food for someone, and so forth.

- Each time people go away from each other and come back together, do a happy dance!
- Pray this prayer this week.
