1	Isaac, God's Promise Confirmed Genesis 18:1–15; 21:1–3, 5–6	God fulfilled the promise of a child to Sarah and Abraham.	"Is anything too wonderful for the LORD?" —Genesis 18:14
2	Miriam, Guardian of Moses Exodus 2:1–10	God helped Miriam be resourceful to take care of her baby brother Moses.	His sister stood at a distance, to see what would happen to him. —Exodus 2:4
3	Samuel, Called as a Child 1 Samuel 3:1–10	God calls to Samuel in the night, and he responds to God.	And Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening." —1 Samuel 3:10
4	David, Shepherd Boy and King 1 Samuel 16:1–13	God leads Samuel to anoint the shepherd boy David as the future king of Israel.	The spirit of the LORD came mightily upon David from that day forward. —1 Samuel 16:13b
5	David and Goliath 1 Samuel 17:12–50	Although a boy, David claims the protection of God as he faces the giant of the Philistines.	David said, "The LORD, who saved me from the paw of the lion and from the paw of the bear, will save me from the hand of this Philistine." —1 Samuel 17:37
6	Maidservant of Naaman, a Young Evangelist 2 Kings 5:1–15	A young girl proclaims the salvation of God as available through the prophet Elisha.	[The maidservant said], "If only my lord were with the prophet who is in Samaria! He would cure him of his leprosy." —2 Kings 5:3
7	Jeremiah, the Boy-Prophet Jeremiah 1:4–10	God calls young Jeremiah to speak prophetically to the covenant people.	Then the LORD put out his hand and touched my mouth; and the LORD said to me, "Now I have put my words in your mouth." —Jeremiah 1:9

8	Josiah, Boy King of Judah 2 Kings 22:1–2; 23:1–3	Josiah became king at eight years old; in adulthood he restored the law and worship of the people of God.	[Josiah] did what was right in the sight of the LORD. —2 Kings 22:2
9	Twelve-Year-Old Jesus Luke 2:40–52	Jesus stays at the temple to talk about faith.	“Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father’s house?” —Luke 2:49
10	Kids Came to Jesus Mark 10:13–16	Jesus welcomes and blesses kids.	And [Jesus] took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them. —Mark 10:16
11	A Boy Gives His Lunch John 6:1–14	A young boy gives his food and Jesus feeds a multitude with it.	“There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?” —John 6:9
12	Timothy, a Minister of God 2 Timothy 1:1–5; 1 Timothy 4:12–16 (NIRV)	Timothy, who was a youth and learned about faith from his mother and grandmother, served God.	Don’t let anyone look down on you because you are young. Set an example for the believers in what you say and in how you live . . . in how you love and in what you believe. —1 Timothy 4:12a
13	We Are Kids of God 1 John 3:1a	I am a child of God.	See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. —1 John 3:1a
