2	Paul Doesn’t Quit the Quest Acts 9:19–28	In the face of persecution, Paul doesn’t quit preaching.	Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. —Philippians 3:12
3	Paul Mentors Timothy Acts 16:1–5; 2 Timothy 3:10–11	Paul is a mentor to Timothy.	Now you have observed my teaching, my conduct, my aim in life, my faith, my patience, my love, my steadfastness, my persecutions, and my suffering. —2 Timothy 3:10–11
4	Paul Meets Lydia Acts 16:11–15	Paul preaches, and Lydia becomes a follower of Jesus.	Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing. —1 Thessalonians 5:11
5	Paul and Silas Pray in Prison Acts 16:16–40	Paul and Silas prayed and praised while in peril.	I can do everything by the power of Christ. He gives me strength. —Philippians 4:13 (NIRV)
6	Paul Begins a Church Acts 18:1–11	Paul and his friends start a church in Corinth.	“Do not be afraid, but speak and do not be silent; for I am with you.” —Acts 18:9–10
7	Paul Performs a Miracle Acts 20:7–12	Paul saves a youth from death.	Paul went down and threw himself on the young man. He put his arms around him. “Don’t be alarmed,” he told them. “He’s alive!” —Acts 20:10 (NIRV)

8	Paul Prophesies; All Hands on Deck! Acts 27	Paul has a vision to trust God.	[Paul] took some bread and gave thanks to God. He did this where they all could see him. Then he broke it and began to eat. All of them were filled with hope. —Acts 27:35–36 (NIRV)
9	Paul Provides Comfort Acts 28:1–10	Paul helps people, and they help Paul.	Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing. —1 Thessalonians 5:11
10	Paul’s Letter about Love 1 Corinthians 13:4–8, 13	Paul writes to the church in Corinth about love.	And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love. —1 Corinthians 13:13
11	Paul’s Letter about Living as Christians Colossians 3:12–14	Paul writes to the church in Colossae about how to live as followers of Jesus.	Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. —Colossians 3:13
12	Paul’s Letter about the Fruit of the Spirit Galatians 5:22–23	Paul writes to the churches in Galatia about the fruit of the Spirit.	The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. —Galatians 5:22–23
13	Paul’s Letter about Always 1 Thessalonians 5:16–18	Paul writes to the church in Thessalonica about what they should always be doing.	Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. —1 Thessalonians 5:16–18
